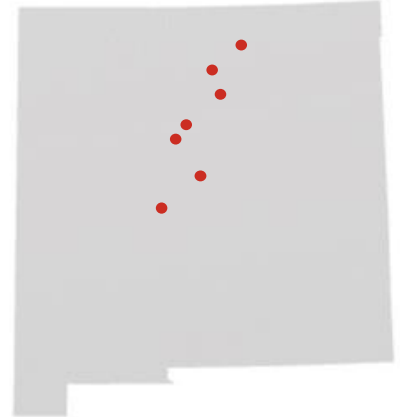

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About GEAR UP New Mexico

Gaining Early Awareness & Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) New Mexico is a seven-year initiative funded by the U.S. Department of Education. GEAR UP New Mexico (GUNM), a division of the New Mexico Higher Education Department, is at work in 11 school districts in our state. The mission of GUNM is to increase the number of students going to post-secondary schools, enhance the college-going culture in our communities, and to improve access and opportunities within state colleges and universities. Across the state, GEAR UP New Mexico partners with eight high schools and seven middle schools in Albuquerque, Bernalillo, Española, Mountainair, Santa Fe, Socorro, and Taos to support over 7,500 students.



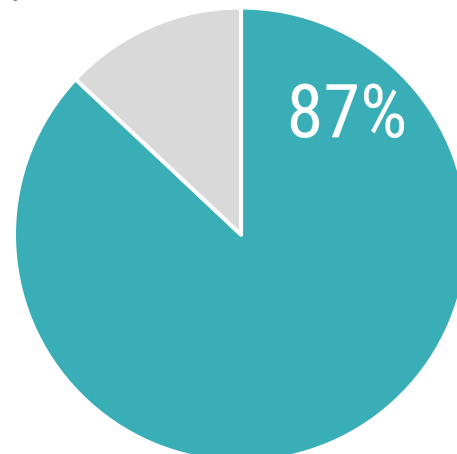
GEAR UP New Mexico Activities

During the 2021-2022 school year, 87% of GUNM students participated in at least one GEAR UP activity during the school year. Highlights from 2021-2022 GUNM activities are provided below.

- A total of 505 GUNM students went on college visits to sixteen different college campuses in New Mexico and Colorado.
- Seventy-six percent of GUNM students participated in counseling and advising activities focused on 8th grade transition, AVID, college applications, dual enrollment, and college readiness.
- Forty-seven percent of GUNM students participated in GEAR UP workshops to reinforce careers, student success on the SAT, and community service.
- GEAR UP New Mexico hosted its first annual Girls in STEM conference with 83 GUNM girls from across the state. During the conference students learned about careers in the STEM field directly from female professionals in the field.

Keeping GEAR UP in the school will continue to assist and guide students with what is needed to pursue their college education. It will also give them more knowledge and self-confidence.

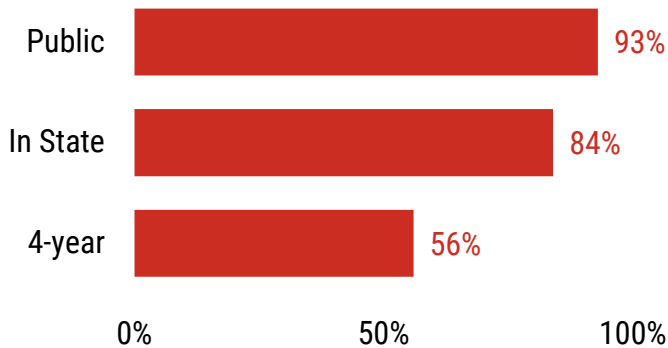

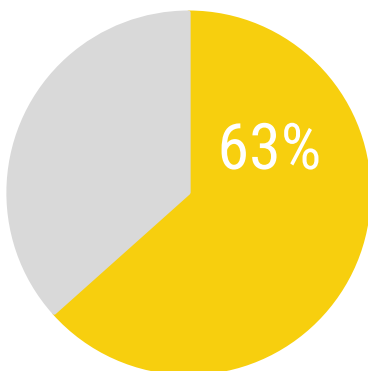
Postsecondary Enrollment

Forty-two percent of GEAR UP New Mexico graduates (n=975) from the class of 2021 enrolled in postsecondary within 1 year of high school graduation. The top five institutions include UNM, Santa Fe Community College, CNM, Northern NM College, and NMSU.

Among the 406 students who graduated and enrolled, most (93%) attended public institutions. Eighty-four percent of enrollees attended in-state institutions, and more than half (56%) of enrollees attended 4-year institutions.



Nearly two-thirds of senior survey respondents plan to continue their education after graduation.

FAFSA Completion

FAFSA completion is a strong predictor of postsecondary enrollment particularly among low-income students. Students from the lowest socioeconomic quintile who completed a FAFSA were 127% more likely to be enrolled in the fall following high school graduation than their counterparts without a FAFSA completion (NCAN, 2019).

As of July 31, 2022, thirty-eight percent of GEAR UP New Mexico seniors had completed the FAFSA. These data will be updated once the FAFSA window for the class of 2022 is closed.
